In the early 1950's a group of "stay at home" Moms decided to start a club of sorts. They would meet every two weeks at different homes to visit and do any work the hostess had for them, such as mending, ironing, quilting, etc. If the hostess for that day wanted an all day meeting, it was potluck. Dues were 10 cents each meeting. They met only during school sessions. On the last meeting of the year the dues were used for all to go out and eat. That was only ladies day—no kids.
