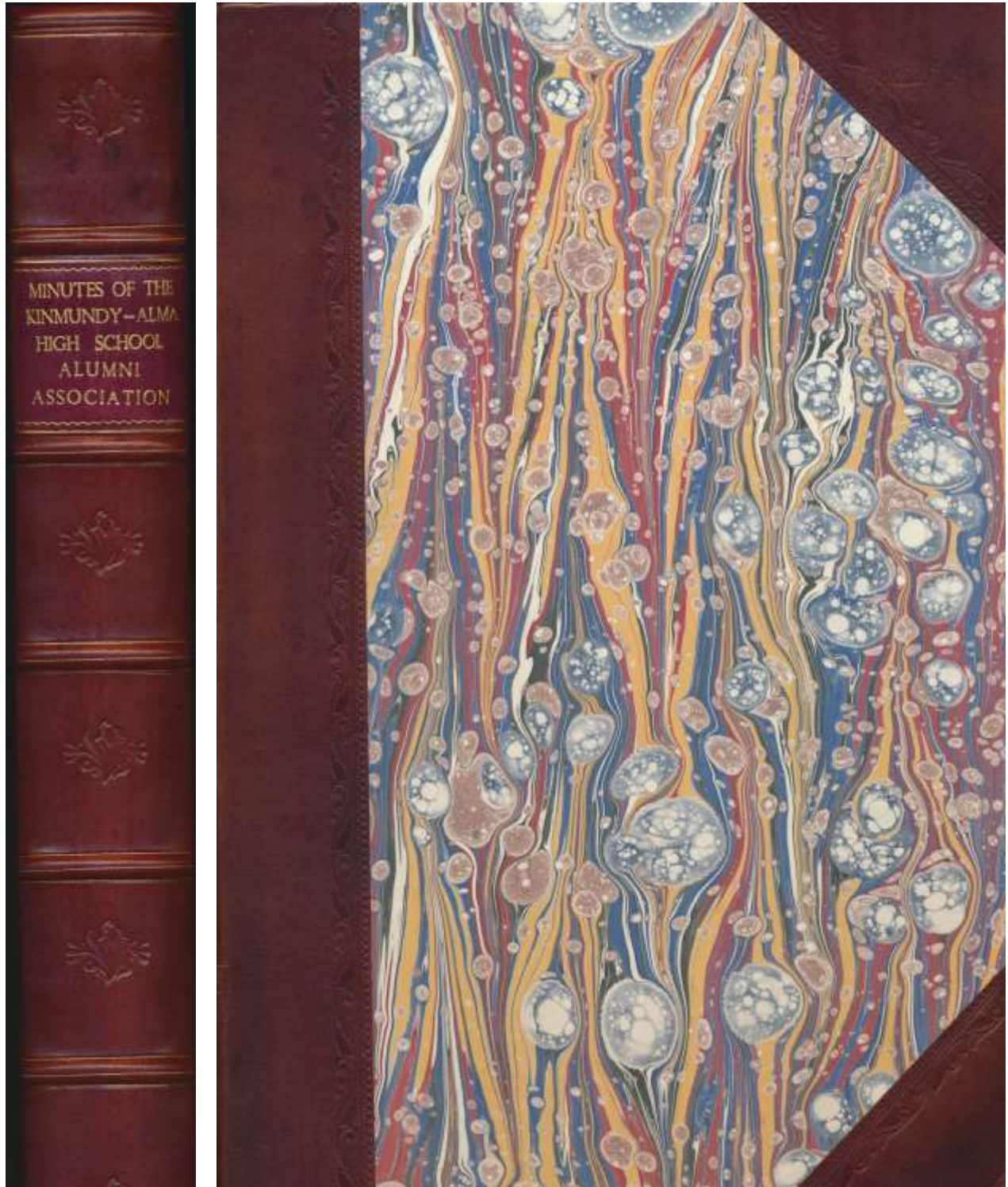


Minutes of the Kinmundy-Alma High School Alumni Association

History Of The Kinmundy Schools

As Delivered At The Alumni Banquet

by Elwyn Cheatum

In the mid 1820's and early 1830's as settlers moved into this area mention is made about their concern for a better education for their children. The most populated area in the 1830's was northwest of what is now the City of Kinmundy (possibly in the area of the Donald Robb home).

Early settlers would have the most intelligent neighbors hold learning sessions for all of the children in the surrounding area. As this system grew it became necessary to have a special building to hold these "learning sessions". The first such building was erected in 1837 northwest of Kinmundy. This building was a log cabin with a large fireplace in one end. It had a log floor and no windows.

As the settlers moved eastward to the area which is now the City of Kinmundy, the log cabin was also moved. This log cabin served as the first school and was located on the road leading to Evergreen Cemetery just west of the C&E&I-Mo Pac Railroad crossing in the curve where the road turns north. It served as the first school until 1856.

The City of Kinmundy was surveyed and laid out in 1857 and a new school was built that year. It was a frame building 38x24. It was built on Fremont Street on the north side of the C.B. French residence. The district was quite popular and the school became overcrowded in the mid 60's. A hall was rented for the older students on 3rd street just east of Illinois Central tracks on the north side. (No building stands at this location now.) School was conducted under this arrangement until 1885.

In the fall of 1865 a new 4 room school was built on the same grounds that is now used for the high school. The first principal was an ex-civil war soldier. In 1883, the school was overcrowded and two new rooms were added to the north side making it a six room school. This frame building was used for 45 years and in 1910 was torn down and replaced by the ultra-modern two-story brick building.

This new beautiful 2 story brick school served both grade and high school students until 1955 when the new grade school was built on the Louisville blacktop, east of town. High school and junior high

continued in the old building.

In 1912 the school was accredited by the University of Illinois, which meant that the graduates could now enter the University without entrance exams.

In 1924 the gymnasium was built north of the brick school.

In 1940 the school buses students from the surrounding country schools into Kinmundy. This was the end of the one-room country schools. North Fork, Arnold Chapel, Maple Grove, Shanghai, Wilson and others converted their buildings to town houses, community centers, storage or dwellings.

In 1941, high school district 25 was enlarged into Community High School District 500 and in August of 1953 the Kinmundy-Alma Consolidated District 301 was formed.

Growth of our school had made necessary the building of a new cafeteria and home economics building in 1949, and an Ag building in 1954. The new gymnasium was built in 1956.

In 1978 it was determined that the cost of re-habilitating the old building and having it meet modern standards would be too costly. After serving our City and surrounding communities for 75 years the old brick building was torn down.

Many changes have taken place down through the years. Each change presents a new challenge for a positive and brighter future. We should never lose sight of this fact.

Many changes have taken place down through the years. Each change presents a new challenge for a positive and brighter future. We should never lose sight of this fact.

The most recent change took place in 1989. Kinmundy-Alma and Farina-LaGrove School Districts both faced with dropping enrollments and finances, consolidated to form what is now known as South Central Community Unit. Through the consolidation, the students of Kinmundy, Alma, Farina, St. Peter, and other communities within the new district are being given an opportunity to a quality education as well as a brighter future.

History Of The Kinmundy Schools As Delivered At The 1989 Alumni Banquet

by Elwyn Cheatum

In the mid 1820's and early 1830's as settlers moved into this area mention is made about their concern for a better education for their children. The most populated area in the 1830's was northwest of what is now the City of Kinmundy (possibly in the area of the Donald Robb home).

Early settlers would have the most intelligent neighbors hold learning sessions for all of the children in the surrounding area. As this system grew it became necessary to have a special building to hold these "learning sessions". The first such building was erected in 1837 northwest of Kinmundy. This building was a log cabin with a large fireplace in one end. It had a log floor and no windows.

As the settlers moved eastward to the area which is now the City of Kinmundy, the log cabin served as the first school and was located on the road leading to Evergreen Cemetery just west of the CE&I Mo Pac Railroad crossing in the curve where the road turns north. It served as the first school until 1856.

The City of Kinmundy was surveyed and laid out in 1857 and a new school was built that year. It was a frame building 36x24. It was built on Fremont Street on the north side of the C. B. French residence. The district was quite popular and the school became overcrowded in the mid 60's. A hall was rented for the older students on 3rd street just east of Illinois Central tracks on the north side. (No building stands at this location now.) School was conducted under this arrangement until 1865.

In the fall of 1865 a new 4 room school was built on the same grounds that is now used for the Middle School. The first principal was an ex-civil war soldier. In 1883, the school was overcrowded and two new rooms were added to the north side making it a six room school. This frame building was used for 45 years and in 1910 was torn down and replaced by the ultra-modern two story brick building.

This new beautiful 2 story brick school served both grade and high school students until 1955 when the new grade school was built on the Louisville blacktop, east of town. High school and junior high continued in the old building.

In 1912 the school was accredited by the University of Illinois, which meant that the graduates could now enter the university without entrance exams.

In 1924 the gymnasium was built north of the brick school.

In the 1940's the school bussed students from the surrounding country schools to Kinmundy. This was the end of the one-room country school. North Fork, Arnold Chapel, Maple Grove, Shanghai, Wilson and others converted their buildings to town houses, community centers, storage or dwellings.

In 1941, high school district 25 was enlarged into community high school district 500 and in August 1953 the Kinmundy-Alma Consolidated District 301 was formed.

Growth of our school had made necessary the building of a new cafeteria and home economics building in 1949, and an Ag building in 1954. The new gymnasium was built in 1956.

In 1978 it was determined that the cost of re-habilitating the old building and having it meet modern standards would be too costly. After serving our city and surrounding communities for 75 years the old brick building was torn down.

Many changes have taken place down through the years. Each change presents a new challenge for a positive and brighter future. We should never lose sight of this fact.

The most recent change took place in 1989. Kinmundy-Alma and Farina-LaGrove School Districts, both faced with dropping enrollments and finances, consolidated to form what is now known as South Central Community Unit. Through the consolidation, the students of Kinmundy, Alma, Farina, St. Peter, and other communities within the new district are being given an opportunity to a quality education as well as a brighter future.

ALUMNI BANQUET 1994

The alumni banquet was held May 28, 1994 at 6:30 PM in the Kinmundy Community Center. The invocation was given by Brother Rurty Courson.
